Do It Again Day 2: Verse 2

I know the night won't last Your word will come to pass My heart will sing Your praise again Jesus You're still enough Keep me within Your love My heart will sing Your praise again

Scripture Reference

But I will sing of your strength, in the morning I will sing of your love; for you are my fortress, my refuge in times of trouble. You are my strength, I sing praise to you; you, God, are my fortress, my God on whom I can rely.

- Psalm 59: 16-17



Psalm 59 was written in a time when King Saul had sent men to watch David and to kill him. The psalm begins with David asking for God's protection. We pick up in the psalm in a time that David is so convinced of God's protection, he sings praise to God. Maybe you're in a place where your confidence isn't that strong. But, instead, you need to sing praise to help reassure yourself of God's goodness, even in the midst of your unbelief.

Recall the walls you prayed on earlier in the week. Are you singing praises in the midst of those difficulties? Why do you think it's challenging to sing praises in those trials? If you're in a place of unbelief or lack of confidence, ask God to help you choose to praise anyways.
At times, it can seem like morning may never come. The "nights" – our trials – can last so long. But we can rely on God – His promises will come to pass. David had confidence his God would see him through the night – and God did. David one day ruled as King. But for many years before that deliverance, David lived as a fugitive, hiding from King Saul. In the same way, Jesus sees us through each of our nights. His promises in your life will come to fruition, even if it takes longer than you might like.
Where do you turn in the darkness of night? Are you confident in God's protection and deliverance? How can you be patient to God's timing for His deliverance?



our fortress – a place of safety. When everything else feels unsafe, you can turn to Jesus for protection.
Do you turn to Jesus for both strength and protection? How do those two things differ? Does one provide more comfort to you in your nights? Can your heart sing of praise for one of these?
Above all, we can sing of God's love. Because Jesus does love us. He will keep you in His love. He will be with you in your night and He will be with you in your morning.
Take a few minutes to sing praises to your heavenly Father. Write a prayer of His glory, His love, His mercy in your life.

As the song and the psalmist point out, God is enough. He is our strength AND our fortress.
