Scripture Reference

Trust in the Lord with all your heart
and lean not on your own understanding;
in all your ways submit to him,
and he will make your paths straight.

– *Proverbs 3: 5-6*



This week we've focused on two very important aspects of a believer's life: storms of life and God's callings. How we handle both of these aspects is important and impactful to us, those around us, and to God. Our scripture today tells us to trust in the Lord. Submit to Him and He will make our paths straight. As our song puts it, we must be led where our trust is without borders, going deeper than our feet could ever wander.

What does it mean to trust in the Lord with all your heart? Are you trusting Him without borders? How do you submit to Him? How can you more deeply submit to Him? Are you trusting Him to take you deeper than your feet could ever wander? Talk through some of these questions with your Heavenly Father.

So, how do we trust the Lord and submit to Him? Our scripture tells us to lean not on our own understanding. Yesterday, we discussed that emotions can be like waves, everchanging and never steady. For this reason, we must not think with feelings or emotions. Rather, we must think according to Truth – God's Truth. To know His Truth, we must know His Word. Psalm 119 talks of hiding His Word in our hearts.

How are you continuing to grow your knowledge and understanding of God's Word? What is the difference between knowledge and understanding? How can you more regularly or deeply come to know and understand His Word? Commit one tangible step today that you will work on in the coming weeks to better know and understand God's Word.



A large part of our scripture and song today imply obedience. We talked about it earlier this week and can't overlook its presence yet again. Part of our relationship with Jesus requires obedience. At times, we may need to ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with that obedience. Whether we call on the Lord for filling up or He's already filled us up, in obedience to God's promptings, we can go deeper than we are capable of on our own. He will lead us in the path of righteousness. If we ask for it, He will fill us with energy, trust, courage, and faith – all the things we discussed this week that, as sinners, we lack at times.

How has obedience in your life led to deeper experiences? How have you seen God fill you with energy, trust, courage, or faith in times of obedience? Has the Holy Spirit prompted you this week with an area of obedience you need to recommit to in your life? If so, recommit now!

Let's end this week reminding ourselves of God's truth: He will never leave us or forsake us (Deuteronomy 31:6). He is a very present help in trouble (Psalm 46:1). Whether we're facing troubles or embracing God's callings, we can rest in His embrace. Wherever He may call us, He will make our paths straight. Our faith will be made stronger.

End today thanking your Heavenly Father for His Truth found in His Word. Thank Him for all the places, challenges, and callings He has brought into your life so far and for all that He will bring in your future. Ask the Holy Spirit to be an ever-present source of comfort and encouragement as you seek to know and become like Jesus.
