## *Scripture Reference*

You, God, are my God,  
earnestly I seek you;  
I thirst for you,  
my whole being longs for you,  
in a dry and parched land  
where there is no water.  
I have seen you in the sanctuary  
and beheld your power and your glory.  
Because your love is better than life,  
my lips will glorify you.

- *Psalm 63:1-3*



The Psalms can be such a powerful way to pray scripture and Psalm 63 is no exception. Today, we'll dig into the beginning of Psalm 63 and how it ties to our song. Let's begin in the middle – in a dry and parched land. Our lives on this side of heaven will be filled with seasons where we find ourselves stuck in the dry and parched land. We'll find ourselves in places where it might seem like there is no water, no respite from the challenges. Jesus Himself, throughout the New Testament, tells us we will have trouble in this world (John 16:33).

*Recall a time where you were in a dry and parched land. What "water" were you lacking? What respite did you seek? How did that make you feel?*

In those dry and parched lands, the Psalm tells us to thirst for Jesus. Our whole beings long for Him. We were made to know God; we were created for Him. While sin may cloud our understanding, the desire to know God in the midst of our challenges and difficulties is wired into our very being. We can get caught up in His presence even in very real trials. We can sit at His feet, caught up in the moment. It's what we were made for.

*Are you thirsting for God in the dry and parched seasons? Can you feel an inner longing? How does sin cloud or confuse that longing? How can you get caught up in His presence even in the dry and parched seasons?*

Psalm 63 goes on to recall previous times of seeing God show up. Seeing God in His sanctuary, beholding His power and glory. As believers meant to connect with God, recalling examples of His very real power and glory in our own lives can build us up. Our lives are filled from start to finish with His power, glory, and blessings – if only we remind ourselves and open our eyes and hearts to see His divine hand. Reminding our sinful nature is very important to the health of our relationship. By approaching him with no intention for blessings, reminding ourselves He owes us nothing, and filling our thoughts full of His presence and power, we can be filled and growing in relationship with Him.

*Where have you seen God before; where have you met Him? Recall specific examples – remind yourself of these. Spend time in His presence – not seeking blessings, not seeking payment of anything – just soaking in His presence.*

Whether we're at the top of the mountain or the bottom of the pit, Jesus is with us. Earnestly seek Him – wherever you are, whatever you're going through. When we seek Him, we will find Him. We can bask in His presence. Asking for nothing, but instead glorifying Him in our words and actions. Because, as the psalmist puts it, His love is better than life.

*End today praying through Psalm 63:1-3. Use it to share your heart with Jesus. Earnestly seek Him. Process through past blessings He's provided you. Glorify Him with your prayer.*
